### SOME DESTINATIONS

- **National Museum of Cambodia** houses one of the world's largest collections of Khmer art. Its collection includes over 14,000 items, from prehistoric times to periods before, during and after the Khmer Empire.
- **Angkor Temple** is a Hindu-Buddhist temple complex within the ancient Khmer capital city of Angkor. It is considered the largest religious structure in the world by Guinness World Records.
- **Banteay Srei** lies north-east of the main group of temples that once belonged to the medieval capitals of Yaśodharapura and Angkor Thom. The temple is built largely of red sandstone, a medium that lends itself well to its elaborate decorative wall carvings.
- The massive temple of **Banteay Chhmar**, along with its satellite shrines and reservoir, comprises one of the most important and least understood archaeological complexes from Cambodia's Angkor period.

Dr. Carter has undertaken archaeological fieldwork in Cambodia since 2005 and studied the Khmer language since 2006. Currently, she is Principal Investigator and co-Director of the Pteah Project, which focuses on examining habitation around the provincial temple of Prasat Baset in Battambang province to understand how this area became incorporated into the expanding Angkor Empire during the 11th century AD.
